This annual report includes a brief summary of activities that were implemented in 2017 by the two offices of the Geneva Initiative: the Palestinian Peace Coalition in Palestine and H. L. Education for Peace in Israel.

Our educational programming over the course of the year reached thousands of Palestinians and Israelis, senior decision-makers as well as opinion shapers, aspiring young leaders and women. We held numerous courses, seminars, workshops and tours, through which we provided people with information and tools to improve their understanding of the conflict and proposed solutions, and encouraged them to actively promote peace. At the same time, we helped keep the two-state solution on the international community's agenda by providing key international actors with up-to-date information and analysis that reflects the perspectives of civil society on both sides.

This year, we also placed a strong emphasis on bringing Israelis and Palestinians together for an open dialogue about the conflict and ways to end it. In the absence of formal peace talks and as the situation on the ground deteriorates, a political dialogue between the two societies becomes more and more rare, and all the more important. As the only Israeli-Palestinian organization working to promote the two-state solution, we see it as our duty to continue to hold these meetings, in order to keep a channel of communication open and to demonstrate to people on both sides that they are not alone in their pursuit of peace.

This will remain our commitment in 2018. We thank our supporters for making our work possible in 2017, and invite you to join us in our journey to the inevitable final destination: Peace.

Highlights

- Over 3,000 Israeli and Palestinian decision-makers and other influencers have taken part in our educational activities.
- We held over 50 meetings between Palestinians and Israelis over the course of the year.
- 84% of graduates of our programming said that their level of knowledge regarding the conflict increased. 87% said that they now better understand the perspective of the other side and are willing to work with them on common issues.
- Graduates of our programming for young leaders have launched 13 local peace initiatives in Israel and Palestine in the past year.
- 52% of our participants in 2017 were women.
- Tens of thousands in Palestine, Israel and abroad followed our Facebook pages, web sites and twitter accounts in Arabic, Hebrew and English.
- In 2017, we partnered with 50 Palestinian and Israeli Civil Society Organizations and supported numerous new pro-peace initiatives.
- Diplomats, foreign ministers and representatives from international organizations regularly attend our briefings in Palestine/Israel and abroad.

Keeping the Dialogue Alive

In 2017, the Palestinian Peace Coalition and the H.L. Education for Peace, organized numeral joint activities for Palestinian and Israeli opinion shapers and decision-makers, including senior party leaders, parliamentary staff, journalists, women and youth. In a time where Israelis and Palestinians hardly ever meet and discuss issues related to the conflict, these meetings enable us to tackle misconceptions, break stereotypes and demonstrate that there is a partner for peace on the other side.

Engaging Palestinian Society

Youth Leaders

During this year, the PPC continued organizing lectures and capacity building seminars for young leaders, who come from various backgrounds and districts. Our work with youth in Palestine aims to build their capacity by raising their awareness regarding core issue of the conflict, enhancing their political and interpersonal skills, and providing them with the space to share their opinions freely. Participants in this type of activities receive training on negotiation skills, problem solving, lobbying and critical thinking and other important skills. Attending such activities provides the young participants information and skills necessary for an active political, democratic and social participation.

This year, the PPC organized 46 seminars that brought together a total number of 1948 students and young leaders from various communities in the West Bank, East Jerusalem and the Gaza Strip.

Engaging Palestinian Society Women

In 2017, the PPC implemented a program for women and young female leaders that targeted some 207 Palestinian women. This series of activities aimed to provide a cohort of women leaders with knowledge of the conflict, and to raise their awareness on the importance of their role in the Palestinian society and political life. The courses tackled various issues related to women participation, including the social and religious obstacles that prevent women from actively engaging in the social and political processes.

The PPC organized 5 capacity building courses, bringing together a total number of 207 females and young leaders in different communities in Palestine.

Engaging Palestinian Society Decision Makers

Our work with decision makers and politicians in Palestine continued during 2017. We organized 16 seminars and meetings, which brought together representatives of different political groups, PLO leaders, senior government officials and local leaders. The assemblies were mainly political seminars and conferences which addressed several important issues related to politics in Palestine and to the future Palestinian state. Also, the PPC representatives held several individual meetings with PLO officials and other decision makers, including from Fatah.

Engaging Palestinian Society Local Community

In 2017, the PPC held 9 courses in partnership with the local community leadership and representatives of local community organizations in several districts in Palestine. These courses were mainly hosted by the local community organizations, either municipalities or civil society organizations.

The main goal of these activities was to provide Palestinian local leaders with the knowledge and leadership skills to engage their constituency more effectively, especially in remote areas, to promote peace and advocate for the two-state formula.


