INTRODUCTION:

The Two-State Coalition, a collective of 28 Palestinian and Israeli civil society, persisted in its efforts to advance its mutual goals of laying the foundations for achieving the two-state solution during 2020-21. Despite the myriad of challenges posed by the political, diplomatic and health context, we strengthened and expanded our work by enlarging our membership, by moving physical meetings to virtual ones, and by focusing on reaching new groups and more people. On the political front, the TSC encountered various obstacles from the aftermath of former President Trump's "Deal of the Century" plan to the escalation in May 2021 as well as the continued creeping de facto annexation and the political division between the Palestinian parties. COVID-19 and mobility restrictions all limited the capacity for regular on-the-ground meetings. Despite all of this, we did not give up and were more determined than ever to strengthen our cross-border connections, double down on our action and advance our advocacy. We overcome political challenges together, and with new opportunities presented by the year ahead, are motivated to act..

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

Joint Palestinian-Israeli Meetings

A total of 64 meetings were held. The joint meeting helped to strengthen ties between the Israeli and Palestinian member organizations creating opportunities for ongoing knowledge-exchange about the domestic situation on the ground in both societies, for coordinating and strategizing joint action, and for ensuring that a strong united message was delivered. In seminars, workshops and meetings, we delved into a myriad of topics from cooperation on climate change, to trends in public opinion and how to overcome the psychological barriers to resolution in both societies. In partnership, we confronted major political developments. During periods of violence, such as the escalation in May 2021, the robust channels of cross-border communication established by the TSC over the years ensured vital correspondence and dialogue between the two sides continued, despite polarized rhetoric in both societies.

Advocacy with Local Decision-makers and Influencers

Holding our political leaders to account and urging genuine political action from key players who support the two-state solution, we engaged with key local stakeholders including members of the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO), Members of Israeli Knesset, foreign ministry officials, governmental advisors, and former and current ministers. Our advocacy and engagement work also encompassed meetings with journalists who have access to broad audiences and can influence the discourse about the conflict.

International advocacy

Engagement with the international community is a pillar of our work in advancing towards a sustainable two-state solution. Members of the TSC led by the Directors General of the PPC and HLEP met with dozens of leading international stakeholders including diplomats based in the region, ministers, and senior representatives. As we build an international coalition of support, we also extended our partnerships to new like-minded peacebuilding organizations in European capitals. These meetings provide a forum for Palestinian and Israeli organizations to share their policy recommendations, identify methods for strategic partnership with international players and call for a more effective intervention.




