Public Opinion Poll Results on Political Issues Related to The Israeli-Palestinian Conflict Among Palestinian Women Living in The West Bank and Gaza

Insights for Polling, Research and Training

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Introduction

The Palestinian Peace Coalition (PPC) commissioned Insights for Polling, Research, and Training to conduct a political public opinion poll among Palestinian women residing in the West Bank and Gaza. The PCC team identified the indicators to be measured in this public opinion poll. The Insights research team digitized the data entry program using stringent quality control protocols. The researchers at Insights conducted a pilot study to validate the questionnaire, assess the receptivity of the general public, and evaluate the sensitivity of the respondents to some of the survey questions.

Data Collection

To collect data for this public opinion poll, Insights used their call center to randomly call mobile numbers from the West Bank and Gaza. Before data collection started, callers were trained on the questionnaire by the data collection coordinator, who has extensive experience in data collection protocols using both telephone and face-to-face interviewing.

Out of the 5000 randomly selected mobile numbers, the callers at Insights call center successfully managed to get 1136 Palestinian women living in the West Bank and Gaza who are 18 years or older to participate in the poll and fill out the questionnaire. This yielded a sample size that is large enough to provide statistically significant results.

The survey was conducted over a 20-day period, starting on April 11th, 2023 and ending on April 31st, 2023. The target population for the survey was all Palestinian women living in the West Bank and Gaza who are 18 years or older, and the data collection process was conducted in a manner that ensured maximum representativeness of this population.

Data Analysis

Insights' data analysis team conducted bivariate analysis of all indicators based on two key background variables: age category and region. The age category was divided into two segments: young Palestinian women aged between 18 to 29 years, and older women aged 30 years and above. The region variable was categorized into two areas: the West Bank and Gaza.

The data was reweighted according to the district variable to make sure that the representation of each district in the sample is similar to that in the overall population. The distribution of women over the different districts was obtained from the Palestinian bureau of statistics latest forecasts for the population size per district.

Main Findings

The poll results indicate that a vast majority of Palestinian women (93.6%) believe that maintaining the status quo of Israeli-Palestinian relations is detrimental to Palestinian society. The survey revealed no significant difference in opinion between women residing in the West Bank and those living in Gaza, nor was there a noticeable difference between the responses of younger and older women. When asked about their preferred solution for the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, 39.7% of Palestinian women supported a two-state solution. The survey results showed that older women were more likely to support a two-state solution (42.1%) than their younger counterparts (34.1%). Additionally, women residing in the West Bank were more likely to support a two-state solution (41.6%) than those living in Gaza (36.9%).

A significant proportion of Palestinian women (37.1%) expressed their support for restarting Israeli-Palestinian negotiations based on a two-state solution. Results showed that older women were significantly more supportive of this approach (41.1%) than younger women (28.3%). There was no significant difference in the opinion of women living in the West Bank and those in Gaza in terms of support for relaunching negotiations.

Surprisingly, 35% of Palestinian women expressed their interest in participating in programs that bring Israeli and Palestinian women together to learn about each other and collaborate on activities that contribute to ending the Israeli occupation of the West Bank and Gaza. The survey showed no significant difference in support for such activities across age categories or regions.

When asked to prioritize issues, Jerusalem was the most important issue for Palestinian women (46.5%), followed by the refugee problem (14.8%) and the Israeli occupation of the West Bank and Gaza (11.5%). Results showed that younger women cared more about Jerusalem (51.4%) than older women (44.2%), but there was no significant difference across West Bank and Gaza.

When asked about the chances of resolving the Israeli-Palestinian conflict if women assumed top leadership positions on both sides, 27.5% of Palestinian women believed that the chances would increase. 18.7% believed that the chances would decline, and 40.6% believed that the chances would remain the same. Younger women expressed more confidence in women's leadership in resolving the conflict than older women.
