CULTIVATING A YOUNG, DIVERSE CONSTITUENCY IN SUPPORT OF PEACE



8 DYNAMIC LOCAL TRAINING COURSES



Local training courses have provided a nurturing and empowering environment, space for young Palestinian and Israeli professionals to address their core concerns and learn about the political, social, and cultural barriers they face in peacebuilding.

3 BILATERAL DIALOGUE MEETINGS



Dialogue meetings allowed Palestinian and Israeli young advocates the space to bridge divides, deconstructed national narratives, and promoted mutual understanding. This series of meetings was essential for instilling the belief in a shared goal and developing a cross-border network of well-informed, committed young advocates.





2 'BREAKOUT ROOM' CONSULTATIONS

Comprising of 4 online sessions, this type of activety allowed participants to share experiences, challenges, and expectations in a supportive peer environment. This strengthened national networks and allayed concerns about anti-normalization sentiments. It was an essential element in our journey toward reconciliation and lasting peace.



RAISING AWARENESS AMONG KEY YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

In our ongoing mission to cultivate a network of mid-level and senior professionals committed to peace, we organized a total of 12 workshops and seminars that brought together some 267 Palestinian and Israeli peace advocates.

8 LOCAL PREPARATORY WORKSHOPS

These workshops serve as the cornerstone of our awareness-raising efforts. Across 17 sessions, participants delve into the core principles of the Dealing with the Past (DwP) model, dismantle psychological barriers to peace, navigate the lexicon of reconciliation, explore the history of negotiations, and debate on proposed solutions.

It doesn't stop there!

We provided tailored professional training sessions that hone participants' advocacy, communication, and facilitation skills. As they acquire this profound knowledge and skill set, the PEACE group is primed for effective dialogues with "the other" during joint, cross border sessions.

Empowered participants, now PEACE ambassadors, actively promote peace and reconciliation within local communities, significantly contributing to the ongoing journey towards lasting peace. As we continue to provide them with essential training and tools, their impact on the path towards lasting peace becomes more notable.





4 JOINT PALESTINIAN-ISRAELI 2-DAY SEMINARS

As the culmination of our preparatory phase efforts, these joint seminars brought together a carefully selected cohort of graduates from the local workshops.

These seminars served as a platform for the exchange of valuable information, insights, in-depth analysis, and cooperation strategies, all aimed at amplifying the impact of PEACE advocates in their conflict-related work, nurturing cooperative actions, and pioneering cross-border initiatives.





ADVOCACY, OUTREACH, AND BUILDING JOINT INITIATIVES

Through this type of activity, we dedicate ourselves to the critical task of advocacy, outreach, cooperation and joint initiatives. We equipped PEACE advocates with the skills, knowledge, and networks they need to actively engage with local stakeholders in meaningful ways.



6 EMPOWERMENT POLICY ROUNDTABLES

These roundtables brought together around 180 PEACE advocates from both sides who engaged directly with key stakeholders like officials, politicians, opinion shapers and civil society leaders. They had the opportunity to present recommendations related to promoting reconciliation through policy change and new initiatives.

With these roundtables, we boosted the advocates' confidence in their ability to influence decision-makers, strengthening their sense of ownership, and fostering purpose in their midst.


